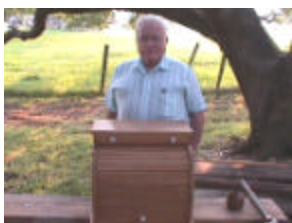
Earl Rutherford turned a handle for his almost flat gouge he made from a lawnmower blade. He also brought a small vase that got a

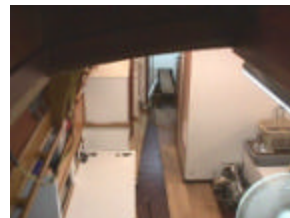
Door Prize

Program



Dr. Vardiman has made a lot of progress on his boat since our last visit. He's putting in the wiring for the instruments and



lights. He says this is a very critical part of the project - it has to be exactly right! It's pretty hard to fix a problem while you're out sailing. The interior is taking shape. He still has some finishing work to do and some comfort items to install. The deck and exterior is almost complete - just a little touch up to do.

Dr. Vardiman really didn't think it would take this long to build his boat when he started in 1987. He started with a set of plans for his 42' Alden sail boat. This is the same type boat that appeared in the movie 'Message in a Bottle'. It has two masts with schooner rigging. When completed, it will weigh approximately 14 tons. He plans to launch the boat in Sabine Pass because they have the proper facilities and the salinity of the water is in the proper range.

Dr. Vardiman has invited our club to attend the launching. We'll let you know when he sets the date
