Tool Reviews

Waid Gauthier brought his Fein Multi-Master tool set for us to see. The Multi-Master starts with the Fein triangle sander and adds a lot of additional capabilities. The



various attachments include a flush cutting blade used for trimming dowels and pocket hole plugs, a scraper blade for any scraping task, a diamond encrusted blade to cut grout between tiles and a profile-sanding package. This is a really well built tool with a lot of capability.



David Rutledge brought his picture-framing hammer with a triangle and round head. The triangle

head allows you to rest the head on the back of the picture and hammer the brads with a controlled, sliding motion. The hammer has a good, solid, balanced feel. It's available from Lee Valley & Veritas at www.leevalley.com.

He starts by gluing a piece of the tree trunk to a waste block. Then he drills a 1/2" hole completely through the piece. Next, he

shapes the outside of the piece and then hollows out the inside. The thinner the walls are, the better - the ornament needs to be

very lightweight. Then he parts the piece off the lathe and sets it to one side while he turns the top and bottom finials.



veneers to the top of each box.

Steve also brought two jewelry boxes he recently made. He used Sassafras on one and Ash on the other. He added exotic

He makes the large end of the finials a tight fit in the end of the piece and glues them in place. He drills a small hole in the end of the top finial and glues a small loop or eye in the top for a hanger. You now have a beautiful, one-of-a-kind ornament.



Dale Clark brought the jig he uses to make the end pieces for a quilt rack. He's built a lot of quilt racks for friends and relatives.
